Secondary 1 Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) Fair cum Meet - the - Parents Session (MTPS)

The Secondary 1 CCA Fair and MTPS took place on Saturday 9 January this year. We shared with the parents the school's mission, vision and the provision of an all-rounded education for their daughters. Head of Department/ CCA and PE, Ms Priscilla Humphries, also briefed all on the CCAs offerings in KC, and went in-depth sharing LEAPS 2.0, the MOE grading system for CCAs. Part of the presentation in the hall also included a showcase of two Performing Arts CCAs, the Chinese Orchestra and Concert Band. Both were very well-received.

This was followed by a short but useful dialogue between the respective Form Teachers and the parents. Parents' queries on a number of school matters such as academic expectations were addressed, and many parents expressed their appreciation of the information that was shared during the morning programme. After that, all were invited to tour the CCA booths which our students had prepared, to allow them to find out more about the various CCAs on offer. CCA leaders from all the CCAs were on hand to assist with general queries and at the booths with more information about their respective CCA.

Parents' feedback was very positive and they found the sharing as well as the briefing on LEAPS 2.0 very informative and useful. They also enjoyed the interaction with the form teachers and the tour of the CCA booths, with many complementing our students on their enthusiasm for and knowledge of their CCA. Subject Information Session

In our continuous efforts to build partnerships with the Sec 1 parents, the Humanities department together with the Literature team organised the Lower Sec Subject Information Session on the Humanities Syllabuses (Geography, History and Literature) on 23 January. The objectives of this session were to give parents:

- i. an understanding of the demands and expectations of the Lower Secondary Humanities syllabuses;
- ii. an overview of the academic programmes which support teaching and learning of the Humanities, and
- iii. an understanding of the assessment components for the Humanities subjects.

The good attendance from parents, the questions that they raised at the session and their affirmation testified to the effectiveness of this platform for parents to deepen their understanding of the subjects and learn the know-how of extending support from school to home.

The team would like to express its deepest appreciation to all parents who availed themselves for the session and hope that the partnership would enable their child to grow to love all the subjects offered at the lower secondary level. We wish all students and parents an enriching journey ahead and look forward to their continued support and presence at other subject information sessions planned this year.

On the same Saturday morning, the Art teachers also conducted a coursework briefing for art students and parents of the graduating cohort. The briefing shared critical information concerning art coursework management and expectations, and the work involved in preparing our graduating students for the coursework component of the GCE N and O Level Examinations. Once again, feedback was positive as both students and parents left with a deeper appreciation of the demands of coursework management.

Level Camps

January also saw our key milestone programme, Level Camps, being held from 25 to 27 January across all the 5 levels:

Secondary 1 Leadership and Study Skills Camp

The Secondary 1 students went through a 3-day personal leadership camp where they were equipped with skills to manage their transition from primary to secondary school. At the same time, they were introduced to the concept of personal leadership, which required them to practise effective time management strategies and plan their daily schedules.

Another segment of the camp taught students study skills, such as looking out for key words while studying, and applying it to a concept map. The Secondary 1 students also displayed resilience during their level camp and there was a great sense of camaraderie within the class as they competed in various games with their peers. Through these personal leadership experiences and lessons gained, we hope that the students will be able to apply the skills learnt within and beyond class.

Secondary 2 Outdoor Adventure Camp

The Secondary 2 students had their level camp at the MOE Jalan Bahtera Adventure Centre. A

total of 241 students attended the camp, alongside their form teachers. The form teachers were closely involved in this camp as it is our belief that enduring learning and endearing relationships are forged through a common KC experience which the students undergo with their peers and teachers

This camp is a signature programme for the Secondary 2 cohort, and was conceptualised with a multi-pronged approach to achieve multiple objectives, especially those related to 21CC outcomes. The objectives of the camp were to develop our students as leaders with the confidence and courage to step out of their comfort zone and stretch their limits; to build the life skills of effective communication, co-operation and personal responsibility and to foster class spirit by promoting mutual understanding, trust and respect.

There was intermittent rain throughout the three days of camp, but the students' spirits remained high. Where there was a need to halt activities due to inclement weather, students and teachers spent the time well singing and practising their campfire items and cheers. This was also an opportune time for the form teachers to interact with and get to know their students better.

Some of the activities that the students did included trekking at nearby Sungei Buloh, challenging themselves on the high ropes tower circuit and rock-wall, attempting the zipline and abseiling wall, as well as the newest attraction at the campsite, the caving system, which all the students enjoyed tremendously. The form teachers not only assisted the girls in attempting the various activities; they also joined in the fun!

Secondary 3 Service Learning Camp

This year's camp focussed on educating the students to be effective facilitators in carrying out service learning projects. In the process, it is hoped that by reaching out to the less fortunate in the community, we can inculcate the values of empathy and compassion in our students

During the 3-day Service Learning Camp, students were taught the skills needed when embarking on a service learning project and about the needs of those they were going to serve, particularly the elderly in the community and those with special needs. Students watched inspiring videos and were engaged in varied fun-filled activities that took them out of their classroom setting. The camp also included a sharing by WeCare at Marine Parade to help students better understand the Marine Parade community and the plight of the many needy and less fortunate families in the area. Through this sharing, students learnt to empathise with the less fortunate in the community and be sincere and enthusiastic in carrying out their Service Learning projects.

On the third day of the camp the students visited their beneficiaries, namely: Goodlife, Foo Hai Elderly Lodge, Sunlove Home, St Andrew's Senior Care, Fei Yue, Bizlink and Touch Centre for Independent Living. The visit was definitely an eye-opening experience and inspired the students to learn more about the needs of the elderly as well as adults with mild intellectual disabilities. The students also realised the complexities of interacting with the elderly and adults with special needs.

Through the visit, our students learnt to better plan for their service learning projects, thus making it a mutually benefitting experience for them as well as the beneficiaries.

In all, the camp achieved its objectives and was well-received by staff and students alike. It is with such positivity that KC hopes to leave a significant impact on the community that we serve.

Secondary 4 Retreat

Our graduating cohort participated in the annual retreat where our student were meaningfully engaged through games, anecdotes and activities that helped them to reflect upon their experiences in KC from the moment they first entered the school.

Taking time to self-examine their personal journeys, challenges and relationships, our students explored themes of self-acceptance, resisting bad influence and growing from strength to strength when facing difficulties in working with others. The students were given space to reflect upon their growth, their relationships at home and school. These reflections were guided to hone the confidence of each KC girl to be more effective and focused in their responsibilities and studies.

The retreat punctuated an important moment of affirmation and reconciliation between friends and family. The students were encouraged to reach out and encourage one another, recognising that we are never alone as a KC family, even in the midst of preparing for the national examinations this year.

Dear parents, we continue in our endeavour to reach out to our girls through love and encouragement. Let us muster strength and courage to shower our presence and support your daughters to grow as women of beauty and grace.

Secondary 5 Educational and Career Guidance (ECG) Exposure

An ECG experience was organised for the Secondary 5 students on 25 January. The objectives were to enable students to develop a greater sense of self-awareness of their own interests and aspirations and to understand the values and attitudes needed in the different occupations in the workforce.

Students were given time to explore the different occupations through the ecareers portal, to set personal targets and to fill up their portfolios through the portal. In addition, the students were engaged in playing an Occupational Interest and Values Card activity where they identified the different occupations they were interested in and discovered the values and traits that are required in upholding those jobs.

Students also attended career talks by 7 different professionals. These talks enabled them to broaden their view of the world of work which also gave them a better understanding of the characteristics of the occupations held by the speakers.

Our Secondary 5 students greatly appreciated the experience and found the sessions interesting and informative.

Moving Forward

KC has done well in the 2015 GCE O & N Level Examinations and we aspire to continue this good work through the dedication and hard work of our teachers and close collaboration with our parents. Registration for these examinations for our current Secondary 4 and 5 students will be conducted in February. We have been working with our girls to strategise their approach towards this major challenge. For our girls to excel in the national examinations, it is important to ensure full attendance, completion of homework, daily self-study and self-discipline. Coursework questions have been released for Art, Drama, Elements of Business Skills and Food & Nutrition and students are expected to spend regular time and effort to complete the coursework on time.

Teachers of these subjects are constantly concerned about girls being absent from lessons set aside for the coursework. It is during these lessons that teachers are able to guide our girls from design to the delivery of the product. For this reason, we seek your help in ensuring that your daughter comes to school regularly and to support us in our journey towards excellence. *If your daughter is unwell on the days set aside for coursework, she would need a valid medical certificate to do the coursework missed outside of the allotted curriculum time.* A summary of the critical deadlines is provided in Table 1 on page 6.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. 2015 GCE O Level Results

In the 2015 GCE O levels, our Sec 4 Express cohort did very well with 87.7% eligible for JCs, 100% passes in 10 subjects and scored distinctions above the national average in 11 subjects. Subjects that achieved more than 25% distinctions were English Language (47.1%), Combined Humanities (44.4%), Geography (69.2%), Mathematics (63.9%), A Maths (72.2%), Physics (47.1%), Chemistry (32.8%), Biology (59.4%), Science (Bio/Chem) (44.8%), Science (Phy/Chem) (82.1%), Science (Phy/Bio) (100%), Malay (45.5%), Higher Chinese (25%), Higher Malay (50%), Hindi (75%), German (100%), Drama (33.3%), Literature (46%) and Panjabi (100%).

Our Sec 5 cohort scored 100% passes in Malay and Literature and achieved distinctions over the national average in Combined Humanities, Literature, Mathematics, Science (Chem/Bio) and Geography.

2. CA Week and Meet-the-Parents Session

The Common Test Week will be held from 22nd to 26th February. The schedule has been issued to students in the last week of January.

We have also scheduled a Meet-the-Parents Session on Saturday 12 March from 9 am to 1230 pm to discuss your child's/ward's progress. Representatives from the various Institutes of Higher Learning will also be present to share what their institute has to offer to our students. Do remember to keep the morning free to meet with us. The details of the meeting will be issued to you soon.

3. Timetable Changes

We will carry out Monday's **even week timetable on 11 Feb** (Thursday, Wk 6) to replace 2 Monday public holidays (Chinese New Year and Labour Day) and another Monday taken up by the respective level camps.

6. Sec 3 Core Literature Workshop on Julius Caesar

Students and teachers alike made full use of a rare opportunity to unpack the Shakespeare text in a workshop conceptualised and carried out by KC Literature teachers, with the aim of introducing students to the text through engaging experiences related to the text.

Held over two afternoons in Term 1 Week 2, students were privy to a one-time-only performance of Caesar's unfortunate assassination, brought to life by an amateur, but nonetheless, heartfelt performance by the teachers. Students looked on enraptured, as feelings of betrayal and horror were brought to life, especially in Caesar's complete shock at Brutus' betrayal as he uttered "Et tu, Brute?". This journey into similar feelings continued as students played a drama game, as well as embarked on a race to experience various activities, in an attempt to read Shakespeare and engage with his intriguing characters.

From an introduction of the setting of the play amidst superstitions, omens and the Soothsayer's warning to "beware the Ides of March!", right down to the final activity of a debate on Brutus and his struggle - "not that [he] loved Caesar less, but that [he] loved Rome more" - it was clear that students appreciated this chance to get up-and-personal with the text.

Students shared their positive comments in a survey held post-workshop, and one student even shared that the teachers should "do this for every cohort because [she] really feel[s] more connected to the text now".

All in all, there was no doubt that students were drawn to the play and appreciated it in a whole new light, and that it was definitely not "Greek to [them]". Perhaps a sign of better things to come?

7. Art Education Programme – 'Art Stage 2016'

On 22 January, accompanied by 4 teachers, 75 EAP students visited the 'Art Stage 2016' exhibition at MBS. This year's theme was 'South East Asia Forum'. Students were exposed to the largest international showcase of South East Asian contemporary art from 170 galleries and 30 global cities. The exhibition is part of the Aesthetic Department's efforts to enhance our EAP students' learning and passion in the area of Visual Art.

8. Assembly Programme – 'On The Red Dot' and 'Talking Point'

On 11 January, two famous local media personalities, Ms Cheryl Fox, a KC alumna and Mr Steven Chia were invited to KC for a talk on their recently-updated current affairs programme, 'On the Red Dot' and 'Talking Point'. This is part of Katong Convent's committed effort towards strengthening our students' interests and talents in the domain of communicative arts.

9. Training for Class ICT Reps

Two class ICT reps from all Sec 1 classes and newly appointed Sec 2 to 5 class ICT reps attended a training session on Monday, 18 Jan to familiarise themselves with the ICT set up in the classrooms and special rooms.

The training session included:

- a) how to care for the ICT equipment in the classrooms and special rooms
- b) safety aspects when handling ICT equipment
- c) how to set up the equipment - computer, visualiser, projector, patch panel
- d) basic - troubleshooting (for computer, LCD projection screens, sound)
- e) basic fault reporting
- f) who's who in the school ICT Support team that the students must approach to report a fault or damage to the equipment, issues with passwords or application software.

The use of MCOonline for Sec 1s will be covered during their GI-ICT project lessons.

At the end of the instructional session, students were given an opportunity to apply what they have learnt to various scenarios e.g., how to connect a laptop to the projector, how to do basic trouble-shooting should there be no sound or no image reported.

ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Speak! Ventures Debate Championship 2016 (SVDC 2016)

Speak! Ventures Debate Championship 2016 was held over the weekend of 23 and 24 January at Serangoon Junior College. About 30 teams from across all three Divisions of the Secondary School debate circuit participated in the 3rd Speak! Ventures Debate Championships.

It was the second time for KC Debate team to be in this competition. This competition was jointly organised by Speak! Ventures and Debate Association (Singapore). This is a preparatory tournament for the SSSDC which served as a good tournament experience for the team. The KC team members were Tatiyana Emylia Bte Hermanto (Sec 4/3), Liyana June Adnan (Sec 4/3), Denise Talia Lim Yen Yen (Sec 4/6), Joan Faith Ong Min Wei (Sec 3/4) and Christine Ong Shu Hui (Sec 2/6).

Denise Lim was chosen to be the 4th Best Speaker in the Silver Division and Emylia clinched the 7th Best Speaker recognition. This was the first time that KC Debate team managed to enter the finals of this competition and emerged as 1st runners-up. It was an achievement that would not have been possible without the support of the Debate Club members, coach Ms Teo En Qi and teachers in-charge.

2. Food and Consumer Education

Three Secondary 3 students represented Katong Convent in an inter-school ice-cream making competition organised by Nanyang Polytechnic. Participants were tasked to create their original ice cream design and flavours based on the theme 'Superheroes'.

The 3 students spent long hours during their November holidays to creatively plan and prepare what was tasked to them in this competition. With sheer hard work and passion, these 3 students came up with black pepper sesame flavoured ice-cream based on their chosen superhero – 'The Catwoman'.

Their hard work paid off as their creation emerged among the top 11 teams to advance to the finals. In the finals, they chose the character 'EISA' as their design product. Beyond emerging

as the top 11 finalists, the experience gained from this competition was both memorable and valuable for the students. We would like to applaud the girls for their commitment in going beyond their comfort zone and congratulate them on their success in their competition. The girls were: Yeap Zen Yeng, Nadine Cheah and Megan Meredith Law, all from Sec 3/6.

3. 46th Singapore National Bowling Championship 2015

Jana Tan Qiu Xuan of Sec 4/3 took part in the 46th Singapore National Bowling Championship in November. We are proud to announce that Jana came in 1st placing among the women in the Graded Division Masters and overall 6th placing.

4. National Youth Championship 2015

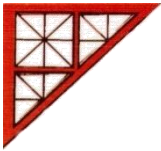
