

How will lessons be like for a student in Sec 1?

In Sec 1, students will be taking

- a) Common Curriculum Subjects
- Music, Character and Citizenship Education(CCE), Physical Education, Design & Technology, Art
- Students will take these subjects in their Form Class.

b) Teaching Subjects

- Core subjects like English, MathScience, Mother Tongue, Humanities
- Students will be banded in different Teaching Groups(TG) according to their given subject band.

 Information for parents whose child has been offered Subject **Based Banding**

Rationale and Intent of SBB

- Each student is different and possesses different strengths.
- To help each student find **fulfilment in learning**, be motivated to excel in what she is good at.
- Starting SBB at lower secondary levels will better cater to the strength of each student in different subjects and give her a stronger foundation in subjects that she is good at.
- A broad and inclusive approach, creating a more diverse and flexible education system, with opportunities for all.



Subject-Based Banding (SBB)

- Sec 1 students posted to the N(A) and N(T) courses may be offered
 EL/Math/Science/MTL at a higher level, based on their PSLE subject grades.
- PSLE eligibility criteria for offering higher level subjects:

Subjects offered under	Eligibility criteria		
SBB(Sec)	PSLE subject level	PSLE AL for the specific subject	Option to take the Secondary One subject at:
English Language	Standard	AL 5 or better	Express Level or N(A) Level
Mother Tongue LanguagesMathematics		AL 6	N(A) Level
• Sciences	Foundation	AL A	N(A) Level

 Each student should take <u>no more than 3 subjects at higher level</u> so as to ensure that students can cope with the overall academic demands.

FSBB for Humanities Subject at Sec 2

- Students in FSBB schools can offer Humanities subjects at a more demanding level from Sec 2.
- The criteria will be based on students' aptitude and interests in these subjects at Sec 1.

Subjects		Humanities subject level	School-based assessment	Option to take subject at a more demanding level at Sec 2
•	Geography History	N(A) Level	75% or higher in specific subject	Any of these subject(s) at Express Level
•	Literature in English	Social Studies N(T)	75% or higher in EL <u>and</u> Pass with Distinction for SS	One of these subjects at N(A) Level

How do I know if my child is eligible for SBB?



 You would have received a Parent Gateway notification if your child is eligible for **SBB**

Should my child take up SBB?



- Consider child's strengths and interests in the subject.
- Especially when more than one subject is offered, consider the child's overall workload in school and personal context, and her ability to cope.
- For some students, learning at a higher level can build their motivation and selfesteem, and provide a head start if they were to transfer to a more demanding course later.



If I have not been offered SBB based on my PSLE results, is there still another chance for me to take SBB?



Eligibility Criteria for Subsequent SBB Intakes

Sec 1 students who perform well at mid year or end of Sec 1 may offer EL/Math/Sc/MTL at a higher level.

Course	School-based Results	Option to offer subject at
N(A)	75% or higher in specific subjectand60% or higher in the overall average	Express Level from next semester
N(T)	75% or higher in specific subject and 60% or higher in the overall average	N(A) Level from next semester



Follow-up Required for Students Eligible for SBB

Parents need to respond via PG by <u>Tuesday</u>, 27 Dec 2022.

- Examples of textbooks to purchase:
 - NA students **accepting the offer to study <u>EL</u>** in <u>1 Exp</u>, <u>purchase only the 1 Exp EL textbooks.</u>
 - NT students **accepting the offer to study <u>Science</u>** in <u>1NA</u>, <u>purchase only the 1NA science textbooks</u>
