STOP



Please note that eligibility to apply for the PFP does not guarantee admission. Admission is subject to competition based on merit and the availability of vacancies, and in open competition with other eligible applicants based on merit.

PFP

- **1-year programme**. Prepares polytechnic-bound N(A) students for entry into the relevant Polytechnic Diploma courses.
- Serves as an alternative to Sec 5
- Eligibility criteria:
 - Gross ELMAB3 ≤ 12 and
 - Subject Specific Requirements
- Course posting:
 - Net ELMAB3

- Eligible students will receive Form P on O-Level results release day
- Maximum 5 choices
- · While waiting for PFP eligibility in Jan 2025, students can either:
 - Progress to Sec 5 in Jan
 - Apply for DPP(JIE'H')/JIE'N' and attend ITE
- Students should only withdraw from Sec 5 / DPP after they have accepted PFP offer.
- Application results will be released by end-Jan 2025.



2. Administrative Instructions

Students who are only interested in applying for the PFP

- should first progress to Sec 5NA
- may then apply for the PFP upon receiving Form P at the release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025
- if application is successful, will withdraw from Sec 5NA by the end of January 2025
- all PFP-bound students are required to attend Sec 5NA classes up till **31 January 2025**.

Students who are only interested in applying for the DPP

- should apply immediately
- you are encouraged to apply for both DPP and Nitec under the JIE.
- if you accept a DPP offer, you will not be required to return for Sec 5NA

Students who are interested in applying for both the PFP and DPP

• Option 1: Progress to Sec 5N(A) and then apply for both the PFP and DPP upon release of the GCE O-Level examination results in January 2025.

OR

• Option 2: Apply for DPP in December 2024 and PFP in January 2025.

* Students who are offered a place in both the PFP and DPP may only accept one course offer. Students who accept both offers will have both offers voided. 4NA students who do not have a confirmed place in DPP, 3-year Higher Nitec or Nitec Programme at ITE but are eligible for progression to 5NA
