STOP



Important Concepts

Usually involves comparing your **net** aggregate with that of other students.

Net : after deducting CCA bonus point

Posting is subject to competition based on **merit** and **availability** of places.

- Eligible students will receive **Form P** on O-Level results release day
- Maximum **5 choices**
- While waiting for PFP eligibility in Jan 2025, students can either:
 - Progress to Sec 5 in Jan
 - Apply for DPP(JIE'H')/JIE'N' and attend ITE
- Students should only withdraw from Sec 5 / DPP **after** they have accepted PFP offer.
- Application results will be released by end-Jan 2025.

DPP (JIE'H')

- January: **10-week** preparatory course
- April: **2-year *Higher Nitec*** course
- Assured of a place in a related polytechnic course, **subject to achieving the qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA)** of the 2-year *Higher Nitec* course
- To be eligible, must meet
 - **Gross ELMAB3 \leq 19** and
 - **Entry Requirements**
- Course posting:
 - **Net ELMAB3**
- Can use **Sec 4 prelim results** for O-Level subjects that are pending results release in application for DPP. O-Level results will be **verified** for continuation in DPP.



DPP (JIE'H')

- Up to **12 choices** (course and college)

E.g. ***Higher Nitec in Accounting*** at **College Central** and at **College West** are taken as **2 choices**

- May apply for DPP & JIE'N' **concurrently** – **2 separate admission exercises** on ITE website.
- If DPP application is successful, student will not be offered a course under JIE'N'.

Applicants applying for these courses are strongly encouraged to indicate them as their **first choice**.

Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend **an interview** to assess their suitability for the course. Applicants who are not short-listed and those who are not successful at the interviews will be considered for their **remaining choices**. These choices will be for courses **without the need for interviews**.



DPP (JIE'H'), JIE'N'

Traineeship

- 1 to 2 years formal training arrangement
- Entry Requirements:
 - Completed at least Secondary 3 N-Level education (or equivalent) or a pass in English/ Mathematics & 2 other subjects
- Work full-time and consequently earn full time salary and enjoy employee benefits.

JIE 'E'

- 4-year Higher Nitec /3-Year Nitec Courses
- For N(T) students with 0 or 1 N(T) Level pass
- Students are strongly encouraged to apply for both JIE 'N' and JIE 'E'.



Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE)

ALL students in N(T) and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for JIE.
Those who were unsuccessful in EAE are also eligible for JIE.

Participation in JIE Main Phase is key to securing a place in ITE!

Use all 12 JIE choices wisely, as competition for 3-year Higher Nitec courses is keen!

Do consult your teachers / ECG counsellors to help you make your choices!

Do use the Last Aggregate Score (LAS) published in ITE's admission portal to help you make your course choices.

If you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the Enhanced Foundation Programme (EFP).

If you are eligible for EFP, make sure you apply for both the EFP and the 2-year Nitec/3-year Higher Nitec!

The EFP helps to build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundations that will enable you to successfully complete your course!

If you are counter-offered a course, accept it first before appealing for another course you may be more interested in!

2. Administrative Instructions



Students who are only interested in applying for the PFP

- should first progress to Sec 5NA
- may then apply for the PFP upon receiving **Form P** at the release of the GCE O-Level results in January 2025
- if application is successful, will withdraw from Sec 5NA by the end of January 2025
- all PFP-bound students are required to attend Sec 5NA classes up till **31 January 2025**.

Students who are only interested in applying for the DPP

- should apply immediately
- you are encouraged to apply for **both DPP and Nitec** under the JIE.
