2. Key Changes in 2026

The school regularly conducts reviews to improve school processes and programmes. Arising from reviews and references to new guidelines, the following changes will be implemented in 2026.

a. Leaving School Premises

From 2026, students can only leave the school premises from 1.30 p.m. onwards. If their lessons end earlier, they can revise their work in the library or meet teachers for consultations. The lunch-out policy remains where students can leave the school for lunch

after 1.30 p.m. and return to school for afternoon programmes. Students who prefer to have their lunch in school can continue to do so in the school canteen.

b. Midday Break

Currently, students have a snack break during period 3 or 8 to complement their recess breaks. From 2026, the snack break will be folded into a 10-minute break in class at 11.50 a.m. daily. This midday break provides students with a meaningful pause during their day. It begins with quiet contemplation and prayer and is an opportunity for students to refocus their thoughts. Following which, students can have a snack or take a stretch break to reenergize physically.

c. Mobile Device Policy

In line with enhanced measures to cultivate healthier screen use habits among students, the school has updated our Mobile Device Policy for 2026. The policy covers both mobile phones and smart watches.

Storage of Devices

Currently, students are allowed to use their devices before and after school in designated areas. In 2026, students can still use their devices before school starts but are required to **keep their devices in their personal lockers by 7.35 a.m. (by 8.35 a.m. on Thursdays)**, so that they are prepared to start the school day. Students should be responsible for their belongings; hence we urge all students to ensure that they have a lock to secure their lockers. Mobile devices are not allowed during curriculum time, which include afternoon lessons, programmes and CCAs.

Consequences of Misuse

Discipline is an educative process, and consequences will be meted out to students who break school rules. Currently, the consequences of misuse start with confiscation of the device for one week. From 2026, the following consequences will be meted out:

Consequences

- Mobile device will be confiscated for the day.
- Parents/Guardians will receive a call from a school personnel and be required to collect the mobile device from the General Office by 5pm on the same day.
- Students will also attend detention class and submit a reflection on their actions.
- The duration of detention class will increase by one hour for each subsequent offence.

Teaching students responsible use and management of their mobile devices remains the cornerstone of our Mobile Device Policy, and I seek your support to work with the school in guiding them. For students who break the rules, it is an opportunity to learn that there are consequences to our choices and actions, and the disciplinary process helps them learn self-management and responsible decision making.

3. Start of School Year

a. Orientation

Orientation is a key school programme where we structure time and space for students to transit to a new school year, build relationships and learn new knowledge and competencies. Details of the Orientation programme will be emailed to students by 31 Dec 2025. For students without email accounts (e.g. sec 1 students, newly posted students

etc), the programme will be shared with them on the first day of school. Information on the first week of school is as follows:

b. Timetable

School will continue to start at 7.35 a.m. daily, except on Thursdays when we start at 8.35 a.m. Due to the later reporting time, recess on Thursdays will take place later. Please ensure that your daughter/ward has sufficient breakfast, especially when she has a later recess.

c. Excuse from School

School attendance is critical for students' development and success, and students should see a doctor and obtain a medical certificate if they are unwell. While the school will accept up to **3 excuse letters per term** from parents/guardians, I seek your support to inculcate the value of showing up for school and duties in the girls.

The Session will comprise talks by school personnel and a sharing in class by Form Teachers. Besides the above-mentioned touchpoints, parents/guardians can also contact teachers throughout the year to discuss your daughter's/ward's learning progress when needed.

Parents Gateway (PG) is the main channel for dissemination of information as well as for you to give consent for your daughter's/ward's participation in selected school

programmes.

5. Administrative, Safety & Security Matters

a. Road Safety

Drop-off

You may drive into the school to drop off your daughter/ ward between 6.30 a.m. and 7.15 a.m./ 8.15 a.m. (Thu), and beyond these times during inclement weather. Otherwise, please allow your daughter/ward to alight from the vehicle safely and promptly outside the school. As enforced by Traffic Police, drivers should not make a right turn when exiting the school between 6.30 a.m. and 7.30 a.m. Please refer to Annex A for the drop-off location.

Pick-up

For dismissal pick-up within the school, you may drive into the school only after 3 p.m. Waiting or parking in school is not allowed. Alternatively, you may wish to wait for your daughter/ward at one of the public car parks opposite the school.

Pedestrians Safety

The students will be instructed to use the pedestrian crossings at Marine Terrace. We urge all drivers to drive safely, especially during peak hours, to keep our students and other road-users safe.

Please refer to Annex B for a joint road safety advisory by the authorities.

b. Visiting the School

The school puts in place the following guidelines for visitors to ensure the safety of

students:

Visitor Appointments

Please make a prior appointment with the school personnel you plan to meet and register at the security counter upon arrival. If you are driving, we seek your understanding to park at the public car park opposite the school.

Parents'/ Guardians' Access Areas

Parents/ Guardians are requested to keep to the lower foyer and the bookshop. During term time, you may visit the bookshop between 2 p.m. and 3.30 p.m. There shall be no access to other areas of the school unless arrangements have been made for you to do so.

6. KC Parent Support Group (PSG)

The PSG comprises parents who want to be involved in their daughters' school experiences and contribute to nurturing the KC girl. More information will be shared with parents/ guardians during the Parent Engagement Sessions for the respective levels.

a. Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)

CCAs take place on Wednesdays (3 - 5.30 p.m.) and/or Fridays (3 - 6 p.m.). The respective CCA teachers will inform you if there are special arrangements.

b. Independent Learning Days (ILD)

ILDs are home-based learning days. Students <u>do not</u> report to school on ILDs, unless there are special programmes, but engage in learning tasks set by teachers. ILD also provides a platform for Student-Initiated Learning (SIL) where students explore topics of interests beyond the curriculum.

c. Academic Programmes (AP)

To support students in their preparation for the national exams, the school has planned Academic Programmes (AP) for the Upper Secondary students. Please note that AP for Sec 4 & 5 students will take place in the first week of June holidays and AP for Sec 3 students will take place in the last week of October.

d. Catholic Connect



ROAD SAFETY OF STUDENTS

We would like to seek your cooperation in ensuring the safety of students travelling to and from school. As our students are still developing their road sense and spatial awareness, and may be less visible due to their height, your partnership is crucial in creating a safe school environment. The following provide parents of our school's road safety policies and guidelines.

Safe Driving Guidelines

When driving in the school vicinity, please

- Observe speed limits and remain vigilant for pedestrians within the school zone
- Follow all traffic rules and avoid reckless driving or illegal manoeuvres, e.g. turning into the school from the outer lane(s)
- Follow directions from traffic marshals to facilitate safe and smooth traffic flow
- · Avoid the unnecessary honking
- Use designated student pick-up and drop-off points during school arrival and dismissal
- Where allowed, ensure swift and safe alighting of your child on the kerb side with the help of an adult

Student Safety Guidelines

Please remind your child to:

- Use designated pedestrian crossings and avoid jaywalking or crossing recklessly
- · Refrain from running to catch buses, and avoid crossing in front of or behind stationary buses
- Do not play near or on the road
- Stay alert while crossing roads and keep mobile phones away
- Practise the 'Kerb Drill' before crossing:
 - o Look right, look left, look right again
 - Ensure all vehicles have stopped
 - Raise hand to indicate crossing intention
 - Cross briskly when the vehicles have stopped entirely (at zebra crossings) or green pedestrian signal is displayed (at signalised crossings)

Additional Safety Reminders

• If your child must cycle to school, he/she should wear a protective helmet, demonstrate competency in safe cycling and is aware of the cycling rules

By following these safety guidelines together, we can create a safer environment for our school community. Please note that traffic violations in the school zone will be subject to enforcement action.

We thank you in advance for being positive role models and helping us maintain the highest road safety standards for our children.
